Next year it is planned to organise further courses entitled 'POLAND: Europe in practice'.

## How you can help?

The recent floods that hit Poland caused severe damages. Many families have lost their possessions and some localities are still struggling with the effects of the disaster. At this difficult time, any help is of great importance.

In the Świętokrzyskie voivodship, the most necessary items for the victims were collected. The most needed items were and are: blankets, bedding, clothing, cleaning items, hygiene products, long-term food, bottled water and basic cleaning tools (buckets, brooms, shovels).

As Poland grapples with flooding, it is important to involve the public - including foreigners. In addition to donations, which are crucial in the first days of a disaster, volunteers are often needed to help with clean-up, sorting donations or logistical support.

In Kielce, the 'Zielinski Palace' has finished collecting donations, but is looking for hands to work. The help of volunteers is now invaluable, especially in cleaning up the affected areas.

Volunteering is a concrete and practical way to help and can bring relief to those affected. For those who wish to help, we recommend contacting the organisation directly and e-mail: dyrektor@palacykzielinskiego.pl.

Before delivering your donations, it is a good idea to contact

with the chosen donation point to make sure which products are most needed at the time. In addition to material donations, you can also make a financial donation to local charities that coordinate aid for those affected. Your help can make a real difference to the lives of those

affected by the floods!

## PROGRAM 800+

From 2024, the 500+ benefit has been increased to PLN 800 for each child up to the age of 18. Ukrainian citizens who are legally residing in Poland can apply for these benefits on an equal basis with Polish citizens.

In order to receive 800+, it is necessary to submit an application to the Social Insurance Institution (ZUS) via the PUE ZUS platform. The application can be submitted online and the awarded funds are paid monthly to a designated bank account.

For Ukrainian citizens, it is crucial to have a document confirming legal residence in Poland, such as a residence card or a declaration of temporary protection.

In order for Ukrainian citizens to apply for the 800+ benefit in Poland, they must submit the following documents to ZUS:

a) Document confirming legal stay in Poland, such as:

- a residence card with the endorsement 'access to the labour market,'
- confirmation of temporary protection,
- other document authorising legal stay.

b) Documents confirming identity and relationship with the child:

- child's birth certificate,
- passport or identity card.

c) Application form for the 800+ benefit, to be submitted online via the PUE ZUS platform.

## Own business in Poland How to start?

## Non-registered business. What you need to know?

Unregistered business is a form of entrepreneurial activity in Poland that does not require registration with the Central Register of Business Entities and Information (CEIDG). It is an ideal solution for people who want to start a small business without major formalities.

In order to benefit from this form of business, several conditions must be complied with:

- Income: Monthly business income cannot exceed 75% of the minimum wage (currently it is PLN 4300.00 gross).
- No business in the last 60 months: You must not have had a registered business in the last five years.
- Industry: The activity must not include activities that require concessions, permits or licences.

An unregistered business offers the opportunity to earn money legally on a small scale without having to register, pay social security payments or keep complicated accounting records. You only need to keep simplified income records. However, you have to bear in mind the obligation to pay personal income tax if income is earned. Foreigners in Poland may carry out unregistered business but they must comply with certain conditions. Firstly, the foreigner must be legally staying in Poland, which means it is necessary to have the appropriate residence documents, such as a residence card or a visa. In the case of Ukrainian citizens, temporary protection status is sufficient. In addition to these conditions, foreigners must comply with the same rules as Polish citizens regarding an income limit and no entrepreneurial activity in the last 60 months.

### Birds of a feather flock together

As a result of Russia's full-scale invasion of Ukraine, several million Ukrainians left for Poland. In the beginning, financial support from the government was very important. However, Ukrainians are not a nation that lives on donations. They all gradually adapted and found their place. Some gained new qualifications, others found work and still others started their own business. It is about the latter group that I would like to talk more. Ukrainians in Kielce are no exception and, like in other cities, they are opening their own small businesses. Everyone has probably heard of "Pan Czeburek", but it will come as a surprise to many that there is another "Ukrainian" gastronomic establishment on Sienkiewicza Street. It is the Etna restaurant - ETNA Pizza & Pasta. The owners are a married couple, Iryna Sribnenko and Oleh Bushyn, who came to Poland from Dnipro. Although their restaurant does not serve Ukrainian food, but Italian, it is with a Ukrainian soul. Mr Oleh prepares the pizza dough with his own hands according to an Italian sourdough recipe, and only Italian products are used for the filling.

The restaurant also serves delicious pasta. Ms Iryna quips that the quality of their pasta has been confirmed by the Dutch triathlon team, because during the entire championships, which took place in Kielce, the athletes ate at their restaurant.

ETNA Pizza & Pasta is located near Plac Artystów, so if you stroll along Sienkiewka, you can drop in for a filling lunch at the Ukrainian.

## Travelling of a foreigner

Learning Polish is like going on a great, adventurous journey, where every turn may surprise you and every word seems to hide more secrets than Atlantis itself. Understanding this linguistic travel requires courage, determination and... a large dose of good humour.

The first challenge? Orthography! Who would have thought that letters could have so many variations? 'S', "Ś", "SZ", 'Ć' - all sound alike, but each has its own secrets. And when a foreigner happily announces that he has learned to say 'czaszka', he quickly learns that 'szczaw' and 'szczeniak' are a completely different story. Sounds which are exotic rarities in other languages are commonplace in Polish.

And grammar? It's already a real game of contingency puns. The cases resemble mysterious portals to different dimensions. 'Whom? What? To whom? Why?' - these are not existential questions, but everyday dilemmas for every student of Polish. In addition, every noun and adjective is dressed up with a different ending, depending on the mood (read: case) and gender.

Then comes the turn of phraseologisms, the cherry on the cake. Funny phrases such as 'to have flies up your nose' or 'to go out on a limb' sound like mystical riddles to foreigners. And try translating 'to make a fork out of a needle' into another language - it's like explaining the theory of relativity! Despite these challenges, learning Polish has its rewards. Once you've mastered the basics, each new sentence is like gaining another level in the game.

In summary, Polish is a language that requires the learner not only to know but also to distance themselves. Every mistake is another anecdote to tell around the dinner table, laughing about your linguistic adventures. And at the end of this journey, every foreigner discovers that although Polish is a difficult language, it is also fascinating and full of charm - just like Poland and its people.



## Weekend in Kielce - where to relax?

This question deserves a separate column, as the Świętokrzyskie Voivodeship offers many options for active leisure. However, a lot depends on your preferences and possibilities. For example, whether you have a car or not, whether you are planning a one-day trip or an overnight stay, and whether you prefer active holidays or just relaxing in nature.

So let's start with one of the most frequently asked questions by Ukrainians: where can you have a barbecue and what are the conditions? Our answer.

In several parks in the city you will find stationary barbecues, where you can bring your own briquettes and fry sausages, vegetables or meat skewers. However, there is another interesting option for larger groups alcoves with barbecues in the Communal Forest. This is located near the Binkowski aquapark in the Barwinek district. A huge forest area, a field where you can play football, space for other physical activity games or simply a place where children can run around. The gazebos are equipped with benches, tables and barbecues and, most importantly, firewood is also prepared.

And all this is free of charge. However, in order to take up the space, it must be booked in advance by calling 413676583.

So, if it's still golden autumn time and it's not raining, you can try to take advantage of this option. While booking, don't forget to find out in advance what it's all called in Polish. To do so, you can visit the Polish-language version of our information portal.


### How to get there?

## Loneliness in a foreign country

Loneliness is one of the most difficult challenges faced by employment and war migrants, especially after arriving in a new country. Loss of contact with close relatives, the language barrier and unfamiliar surroundings intensify feelings of isolation.

Psychologists underline that the key to coping with loneliness is to build new relationships and find support in local communities. It is important not to be afraid to ask for help many Poles offer support, both emotional and hands-on.

Finding a support group or attending local events can help with integration and a sense of belonging. And don't forget to take care of your mental health - talking to a psychologist can be the first step to regaining balance. Remember that loneliness is a natural reaction, but you don't have to go through it alone.

At the INTEURO Center for Integration of Foreigners, a qualified psychologist from Ukraine, Olha Kholodna, provides consultation to foreigners.

All this is part of a special program launched at the Center called "My Friend."

The main problems with which Ukrainians come forward are related to:

- The emotional and physical survival of the loss of relatives, property, previous lifestyles and the inability to contact loved ones who remained in the occupied territories;
- emigration, specifically the difficulties associated with social, cultural and linguistic adaptation in the new country. The fear and anxiety of integrating into a new environment, looking for a job, changing one's main activity, accessing the educational market and health care system is intensified;
- seeking internal support and resources to cope with stress and ensure harmonious functioning, ability to build relationships and communicate.
